Greetings Residents, Families and Team Members,

In keeping with our promise to keep our Rosewood Greenbrier family informed about the evolving Covid-19 status in our community, here is the update from the last testing completed on 2/22/22. Notification was made to all positive residents' families. As a result of Tuesday's testing, 2 of our assisted living residents tested positive. These two residents were within close proximity within our community with a resident that previously tested positive. None of the residents who tested positive have symptoms. This event is classified as a Covid-19 outbreak per the Center for Disease Control (CDC).

Though this is considered an outbreak, due to advancement of knowledge and protocols from the CDC, as initially communicated, the community will not be closed to the public. You will not be isolated from your loved ones. We do however, mandate that any family member visiting the residents who are positive, utilize the personal protective equipment that we have prepared for you. For those residents who are not positive, there remains no change to visitation.

Residents who tested positive on February 15, 2022, will be removed from isolation today, Friday, February 25, 2022.

As noted from the previous letter, our facility has prepared for this type of situation and is taking the following immediate actions:

- We have made the Virginia Department of Health aware of the positive cases and confirmed the immediate steps that are concurrent with our policies and procedures which we drafted from the CDC.
- We are continuing to test residents and team members as necessary until all residents test negative.

- We are encouraging residents to wear masks when they move around the community but stay as closely to their private accommodations as possible.
- We will discontinue communal dining until further notice.
- We have placed all beauty salon appointments on hold until this outbreak is completed.
- Small group activities will continue. Residents are encouraged to wear masks, sit six feet apart, and use hand sanitizer before and after the activity. The activity area will be sanitized with a disinfectant solution after each activity. There will be no more than ten participants in activities at one time.

Again, we share this information with you not to alarm you, but to keep you as informed as possible. Currently, we ask for your patience as we work through this situation. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Please know that we are always here to support our families and team members. Do not hesitate to give me a call if you have any questions.
